IS THIS JOB A GOOD FIT FOR ME?

Education	Work experience is equally as important to education level in the retail field. There are many entry level positions in retail that are available to individuals with a high school diploma or GED. With the right skills and experience, these jobs can lead to more advanced supervisory positions.
Skills/Aptitude	Customer service is the most important skill in the retail field. Knowledge of sales and marketing, and ability to work in a team is also a plus.
Certifications	Retail certification is voluntary, but may be preferred by some employers. Organizations such as the National Retail Federation offer certificates in areas such as Retail Management, Sales, or Customer Service
Other Requirements	Most of the workday is spent interacting with others – both staff and customers. The job often requires a lot of time on one's feet.

Retail supervisors often start out as cashiers or sales associates, and advance to supervisory and management roles as they gain skills and experience.
