




Integrated Workforce Information System

- <u>Project:</u> Design, implement and test an Integrated Workforce Information System (IWIS), including a uniform job seeker intake and assessment process, that contains comprehensive program and client-specific measures
- Goals: TO 1) empower workforce service providers to make data-informed decisions to improve services to both job seekers and employers 2) enable funders to identify and support programs that work



Research technical requirements for IWIS, including integration with state data systems	Jan-Aug 2013
Issue RFP & select IWIS System Developer	Sept-Dec 2013
Establish data sharing agreements with state agency partners	Jan 2013-Jun 2014
Design, build & pilot IWIS & job seeker assessment process	Jan-Dec 2014
Train users on IWIS & assessment process	Nov 2014-Jun 2015
Staggered roll-out of IWIS & assessment process	Feb – Dec 2015
IWIS sustainability planning	Jul 2013-May 2015
